St. Lawrence Primary School Safeguarding Policy

This policy applies to all adults, including volunteers, working in or on behalf of the school. We recognise our moral and statutory responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all pupils in line with Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) 2025.

Everyone working in or for our school shares an objective to help keep children and young people safe by contributing to:

- Providing a safe environment for children and young people to learn and develop.
- Identifying children who are suffering or likely to suffer significant harm and taking appropriate action.

St. Lawrence School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all pupils. Each pupil's welfare is of paramount importance.

Policy Principles

- The welfare of the child is paramount.
- All children, regardless of age, gender, ability, culture, race, language, religion or sexual identity, have equal rights to protection.
- All staff share equal responsibility to act on any suspicion or disclosure suggesting a child is at risk of harm.
- Pupils and staff involved in child protection issues will receive appropriate support.

Policy Aims

- Provide staff with the necessary information to enable them to meet their child protection responsibilities.
- Ensure consistent good practice.
- Demonstrate the school's commitment to child protection to pupils, parents and partners.
- Contribute to the school's safeguarding portfolio.

Safer Recruitment and Selection

The school follows safer recruitment practices in line with KCSIE 2025. All recruitment panels include at least one member trained in safer recruitment. Enhanced DBS checks, identity verification, references, and right-to-work checks are mandatory for all staff engaged in regulated activity.

Online Safety, Filtering and Monitoring

The school recognises its duty to ensure robust filtering and monitoring systems are in place to protect pupils online. Children are taught about online safety through PSHE, Computing and across the curriculum. The school addresses risks including cyberbullying, sharing of indecent images, online grooming, extremism and radicalisation.

Low-Level Concerns

All staff are expected to report low-level concerns about colleagues or adults working with children. These concerns will be dealt with in line with the school's low-level concerns policy, ensuring transparency, accountability, and fostering a safe culture.

Children Missing Education

Attendance, absence and exclusions are closely monitored. A child going missing from education is a potential indicator of abuse or neglect. The school follows statutory guidance for reporting children missing education and works closely with the Education Welfare Officer.

Managing Allegations

The school follows KCSIE 2025 procedures for managing allegations against staff. Any adult who has harmed or may pose a risk to a child will be referred to the Local Authority Designated Officer (LADO) and the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).

Whistleblowing

Staff must feel able to raise concerns about poor or unsafe practice and such concerns will be addressed sensitively. The school has a clear whistleblowing procedure in place in line with KCSIE 2025.

Training and Induction

All staff receive safeguarding and child protection training at induction and regular updates throughout the year. The DSL and deputies undertake advanced training every two years. Governors receive appropriate safeguarding training.
