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St. Lawrence School Curriculum Letter- Year 4 Summer Term 2021-2022

Welcome to the summer term and our final term in Year 4. Please see below plans for the upcoming months.

Writing

In dedicated writing sessions we will be reading and writing poems around the theme 'The Ocean'. We will be unpicking the poetic devices that the poets have used including metaphors, similes, and personification. The children will then write their own underwater poem.

We will also be looking at creating a persuasive magazine article. During this unit we will be looking at the devices used to persuade. We will then create our own magazine article to persuade people to protect our oceans.

During our reading session we will be reading the novel James and the Giant Peach. We will continue to work on the reading skills of being able to-

Science

Our science units for this term will be 'Teeth and Digestion' and 'Living in the environment' with a particular focus on habitats. Much of the science will be hands on and we will be finding examples of animals living in rock pools and ponds. Throughout both topics the children will continue to develop their scientific enquiry skills, in particular writing a conclusion and recording results in different ways including tables and charts. Children will continue to develop their own investigations which they will plan and carry out. On **Friday 17th June** the children will be spending the day at St.Ouen's Bay to carry out some science investigations based around habitats. Details will follow nearer the time.

Geography/History/ Environmental Issues

Our area of focus this term is The Ocean. During our learning we will be focusing on life under the sea. Food chains. Environmental issues. Sea creatures and Layers of the Ocean. The children will also be encouraged to take part in a beach clean so that we can investigate the types of rubbish littering our oceans and the damage that they are having on the environment. More details will follow shortly.

Art/ DT

During our art this term we will be focusing on Pointillism and studying the artist, George Seurat. We will be using pointillism to create our own underwater world.

In DT this term we will be designing our own moving vehicle. The children will be learning how to saw and secure wood to

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create their own jinx frame. The frame will have wheels and an axle to enable it to move.

P.E.

Our P.E sessions this term will be every Wednesday and Thursday. During this term we will be looking at a danced based around 'Pirates of the Caribbean'. This will enable the children to combine drama and dance into a final production. During games sessions we will be carrying out athletics, basketball, and cricket,

ICT/Computing

In ICT/Computing children will be practicing their typing using Touch Typing. They will be using multi-media to create an advertising campaign about the dangers our seas are experiencing. Alongside this we will be looking at Internet safety and discussing how and when to use e-mails.

P.S.H.E.

Our focus for the first part of the term is 'How we keep Safe'. We will be discussing gaming, using the Internet and safely issues around the beach. Towards the end of the summer term the children will start their P.S.H.E. unit of Living and Growing where we will look at how we have changed so far in our lives and what other body changes we will go through as we become adults. More information will be provided nearer the time and opportunities to view the DVD will also be available. As always, we will be changing our buddies every week and thinking about how we listen and talk to others.

R.E

This term we will be learning about Sikhs and the rights of passage. Through our R.E we will continue to develop our tolerance of others and understanding and the importance of sharing in our global community.

In French we will be learning vocabulary to describe animals and their habitats, and we will learn how to talk about different sorts of homes as well as the words for the different rooms in a home.
