<u>St. Lawrence School Curriculum Letter- Year 4</u> <u>Autumn Term 2022</u>

Welcome to Year 4. I am very much looking forward to a busy and fun-filled term with your children. Please find outlined below the areas that we will be learning in Year 4 this term and general Year 4 routines.

Writing

In writing sessions we will be reading and writing non-chronological reports, looking at the structure of them and then creating our own reports. We will then move on to reading and writing stories set in other cultures. The children will be looking at the structure of a story, focusing on ways of starting sentences, developing characters by what they do and what they say. We will be looking at paragraphing and how to connect paragraphs. This will culminate with the children writing their own story.

Reading

In reading sessions the children will be reading 'Rickshaw Girl' and 'Where the Mountains Roared' both of which are set in India which is our geography unit this term. Through our shared reading the children will continue to develop their reading skills by checking their understanding of a text, discussing features and the structure of the texts, summarising paragraphs, and using a dictionary to check the meaning of words. The children will continue to develop the reading skill of P.E.E. Make a point, find the evidence, and explain what that evidence shows.

Your child will shortly be given a reading diary which will be collected in every Monday and Thursday. Children will bring home a levelled reading book which they be expected to read at home with you. Please can you check that diaries are signed and returned to school on a Monday and Thursday. Once a book is completed a new book will then be sent home. Once I have got to know the children's reading ability there will be more flexibility with the books that they read.

Ideally the children should be reading and discussing the text to an adult for approximately 20 minutes at least twice a week. Discussing a text is vital for the children to develop their understanding of what they have read and why author's write in a specific way. Questions you may wish to use are-

- 1. What happened in the story?
- 2. Where does the story take place?
- 3. Can you find some words/phrases that tell you about this character?
- 4. Where/When is the story set? How does the writer show this?
- 5. What did you enjoy about this story? Why?
- 6. What do you think will happen next?
- 7. What words help to create mood in this part of the story?
- 8. Find a 'wow' word, why have you chosen this word? Why do you think the author used this word?
- 9. If you could ask the character in the story a question, what would it be?
- 10. How does the author show that the character is felling scared/happy/excited?
- 11. Why do you think the author used questions? Short sentences?

SPAG

During our reading sessions we will be looking at spelling, punctuation, and grammar. Our grammar this term will focus on pronouns, standard English, adverbs to express time and cause, possessive pronouns, and fronted adverbials.

Spellings will be given every **Monday** and the children will be tested the following **Monday**. Please can you ensure that homework is completed and carried out neatly. Please can children use a dictionary for their definitions rather than using a device eg: Siri.



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<u>Maths</u>

Our maths sessions will continue to embed the skills learnt in Year 3, this year we will be using White Rose maths scheme, which allows the children to embed and deepen their understanding of mathematical concepts.

We will be carrying out fluency sessions alongside our daily maths lessons. These work on various mental maths skills- egdoubling, halving, pairs to 100 and times tables. It would really benefit your child if they could work on their times tables at home as often as possible as well as completing the weekly maths homework.

<u>Science</u>



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Our science unit for this term will be 'Changing State'. During this term the children will be investigating and classifying solids, liquids and gases and comparing them. Throughout this topic the children will continue to develop their scientific enquiry skills, writing a conclusion and recording results.

<u>Geography</u>

Our geography unit this term will be India. The children will be discovering all about life in India. The weather, the landscape, the food, the people. Our learning will culminate in an India day where the children will dress up and taste Indian food.

<u>Art/DT</u>

Much of our art and design technology this term will be linked to India. During our art session we will be researching rangoli patterns and then making our own. In DT we will be making a toy elephant and decorating it with an embellished blanket.

<u>P.E.</u>

Our P.E sessions this term will be every **Tuesday and Friday**. In our indoor sessions we will be looking at Indian dancing and balances in gymnastics. Our outdoor session will be hockey and then tag rugby. The children will practice the skills of both games including how to work as a team.

Please can you ensure that your child comes into school on those days wearing the correct school P.E. kit and suitable trainers. Hair needs to be tied back for safety reasons and jewellery removed.

ICT/Computing

In ICT/Computing children will focus on Expresso Coding. We will also be carrying out presentations using a variety of media. They will be using Microsoft Word and will be learning how to open documents, change font sizes and how to copy and paste.

Alongside this we will be looking at Internet safety.

<u>R.E</u>

This term we will be learning about Hinduism. We will be looking at how Hindu's worship at home and in the mandir.

FRENCH

This term the children will be taught French by Mrs.Riddell who will be teaching vocabulary for parts of the body, colours and making statements about travel.

P.S.H.E.

PSHE sessions will continue to explore our school core values, looking particularly at what respect means and how they can demonstrate respect for each other's feelings. We will also be looking at how to be successful as a learner, focusing on determination and perseverance. We will then move on to looking at Jersey as a democratic society. Finding all about the States system and laws in the island.

MUSIC

In music this term the children will be inspired to listen, appraise and compose music by Indian composers.

<u>Jerriais</u>

For the next two terms the children will be working alongside the Jerriais team to learn Jersey's native language. These sessions will be carried out with Mrs.Bond who teaches the language through a range of fun activities.
